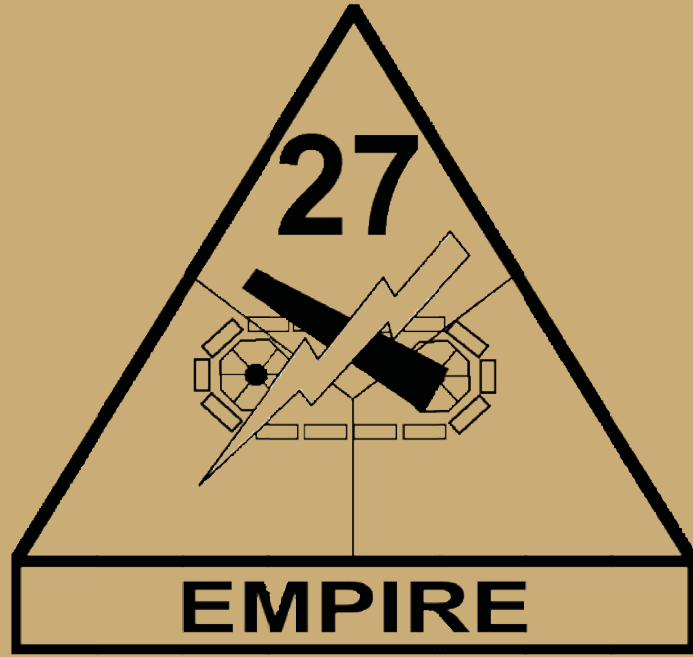


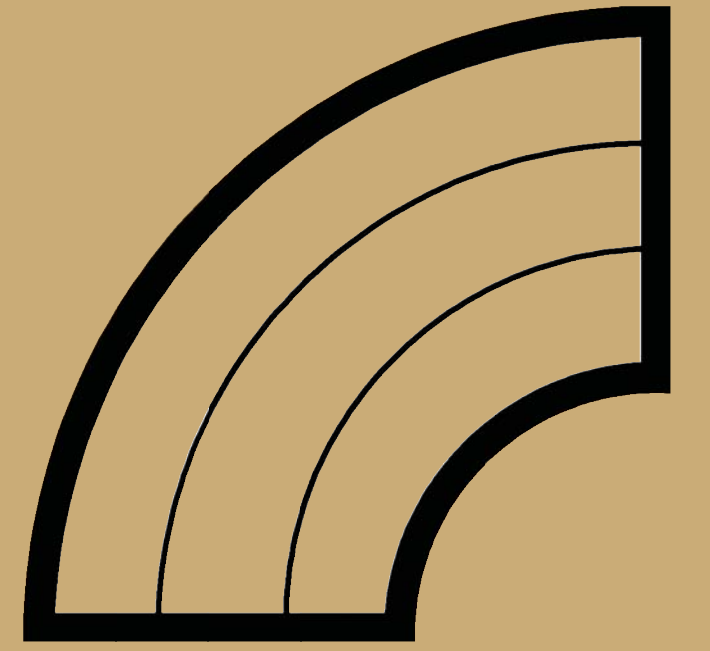
THE NEW YORK GUARD

During this time some members left the unit to join the active services. Some manned the Nike-Hercules missile sites in Western New York, thus becoming known as Missile-Age Minutemen.

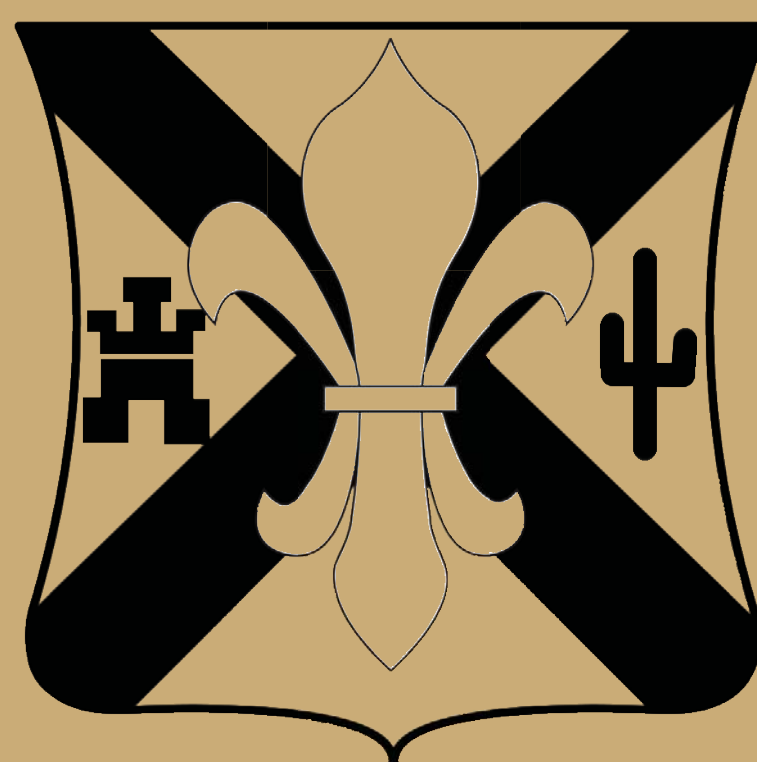
